



Miami	Leys discussed the mission of Parent to Parent. Parent to Parent of Miami is a non-profit organization and	and
Presentation	parent center for children with disabilities. This organization prioritizes giving parents training and resources	resources.
	on how to advocate for their children. They are currently receiving funding from OCEP and Children's Trust.	
	They serve any child with a medical diagnosis as well as children with either a suspected diagnosis or	
	developmental delay. To serve the parent centers, educators, specialists, and psychologists, provide hybrid	
	workshops that provide information and tools on how parents can be advocates for their children. Some of	
	the workshop topics include parent/child rights, IEP, transition meetings, law, and finances.	
	The work of Parent to Parent of Miami has positively impacted the families served in Miami-Dade. During	
	the presentation it was shared 80% of parents report increased understanding of their child's disability, 75%	
	of parents report decreased stress levels, 95% of parents report materials and information were useful and	
	relevant to their needs, 86% of parents report increased access to services and supports for their children,	
	96% of the parents attending IEP workgroups increased their capacity to communicate and advocate at	
	school, and 85% of the families attending workshop report feeling confident with making decisions about	
	their child's education needs. It was also noted referrals to agencies and families are beneficial to the	
	program. For any further program questions, Danielle Leys shared to reach out to her.	
Executive Board	Dr. Brito provided the Executive Board update. The Board last met virtually on Monday, January 13, 2025.	
Update	The Consortium has completed its nomination and elections process for the Committee Chair and Vice Chair	
	roles for the next 2-year term for the 2025 and 2026 calendar year. The new Consortium leadership was	
	announced and shared. The Children Issues Oral Health Committee leadership remains the same. The Board	
	will now host their Co-Chair nominations and elections. Once this process is completed, it will be announced	
	at the next committee meeting. The new Board has begun to discuss and form the Planning Taskforce for the	
	Consortium Annual Event which will be merged with Worksite Wellness Awards Ceremony. This event will	
	be hosted in 2025, and the planning committee is looking for members to sign up. The Board is working to	
	create a digital brochure format with the elevator speech and health agenda message info when meeting with	
	interested partners to join the Consortium. When this is available, it will be shared with the full Consortium.	
	Lastly, the Board continues the conversation on optimal health and addressing the drivers of health.

	• DOH-Miami-Dade WIC Program: Carla Sabugo shared an update on the 11 th Annual				
	Homestead/Florida City Holiday Health & Resource Fair that was hosted on Saturday, December 7 th ,				
	2024. During this event, they hosted a toy drive during the holiday season and was able to give out 1,600				
	toys. On April 30 th , 2025, there will be a similar community resource fair but, on a smaller scale for WIC				
	staff members to learn about the community partners and resources available they can take back to the				
	clients they serve and connect them to services. Lastly, it was also shared once ready for release, the				
	WIC program has a new branding kit that will be available.				
	• Gheorg: Dana Klein shared an update on their App. Gheorg is a mental health and wellness app for kids				
	between the ages of 7 and 12 year's old. They have currently updated their App, and it is multilingual				
	and very multicultural and about 100 languages now. She also shared she is happy to be a resource, and they are looking for research partners if anyhody wants to partner with to do some research with Chaore
