The Office of Community Health & Planning of the Florida Department of Health in Miami-Dade County is currently working on launching the community Wellbeing Survey as part of the assessments related to Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP). This community-driven strategic planning process helps inform the development of the next 5-year Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) based on identified strategic priority areas. Members are encouraged to take and share the Wellbeing Survey if they reside in Miami-Dade. They can also make suggestions for the activities and measures to be included in the next 5-year work plan to be developed sometime later this year.
