EIC member and partner, by Nattaliah Earle, MS, Collective Impact Manager & Miami-Dade County Age-Friendly Initiative Program Manager at Urban Health Partnerships, Inc. gave a 15-minute presentation, *Partnering for Progress: Advancing Age-Friendly Miami-Dade Together*. The Miami-Dade County Age-Friendly Initiative (MDAFI) operates to ensure the livability of all people as they grow in age in the county. The initiative was formed 13 years ago in 2012 with grants, support and collaborative effort of partners, such as AARP, Alliance for Aging, Health Foundation of Florida, Florida Dept. of Health, United Way Miami, Urban Health Partnerships, and Miami-Dade County (a.k.a., lead agencies). In addition to our lead agency partners, the MDAFI includes funders, multi-sector organizations that make up our stakeholders advisory group and actual older adult advocates who make up a separate advisory committee.

These trusted partners help us champion livability with a commitment and strong communication. We've been able to build a foundation for collective impact that has led to policy systems and environmental change solutions.
